unior Angus members entered a total of 441 photographs in the 2004 National Junior Angus Association (NJAA)/*Angus Journal* Photo Contest, the highest number of recorded entries thus far. Photos depicted Angus cattle, breeders, landscapes, farms and ranches, and were judged on creativity and composition.

Judges for this year's contest were Amy Cowan, editorial and communication coordinator, American Hereford Association; Andy Atzenweiler, editor, *Missouri Beef Cattleman*; and Shelia Stannard, assistant director of activities and junior activities for the American Angus Association.

General comments were made by judges

to help juniors learn and improve their photography skills. Many comments pointed out how digital photos lack the high-quality finish needed to place in the contest. Individuals need to take caution when

submitting digital images and notice how pixilated photos can be when enlarged to an 8×10 print.

The yellowish tint to grass, for example, in the digital photos is distracting. To remedy some of these problems, the judges advise those using digital cameras to take the electronic files to a processing center to print the photos. Landscape photos would especially benefit from the extra money spent on processing.

How you position and frame your subject in the photo is also extremely important, and be sure to turn off the date-stamp option before taking pictures.

Overall, the judges felt there were too many digital photos and home-printed submissions. They advised juniors to pay close attention to the category in which photos are entered.

Making their way into the magazine




