## **Great year for business**

We can profess our thanks for the extraordinary year the Angus industry has enjoyed. From a business standpoint, your Association has experienced one of its best years in history. Our number of annual registrations reached levels similar to those of the mid-1970s; however, registration activity

was decelerating then instead of accelerating as it is today.

Your Association observed a 6% increase in the number of new animals recorded in the herd book, a 9.5% increase in transfers of registered Angus animals to new owners, and a more than 12% increase in new members joining the Association.

Increases were also posted in Angus Herd Improvement Records (AHIR) activity, resulting in part from a 2% increase in herds participating in the program.

Angus breeders can also be grateful for the results of an independent survey of stockmen that revealed 68.6% of respondents indicated they were using Angus bulls. With this in mind, it is therefore no surprise that in excess of 35,000 Angus bulls, in sales reported to the *Angus Journal* last year, commanded an average sale price of \$2,707 for a phenomenal increase of \$466 per head. So in essence, more bulls sold for more money — that's demand in its purest form.

We end the year with thanksgiving and enter the new year with much excitement. We know if we all approach the future with resolute determination to maintain our focus on constructing and using tools that improve bottom-line economics for commercial beef producers and enhance consumer acceptance of beef, our Association and breed will continue in the vein of success.
