It allows you to specify ranges of expected progeny differences (EPDs) and to sort bulls that qualify in those ranges.

# Foundation scholarship applications available

To foster the advancement of education, youth and research, the Angus Foundation

will award a number of undergraduate and graduate scholarships this year. Two \$5,000 scholarships will be given in memory of former American Angus Association executive vice president Richard "Dick" Spader. In addition, \$3,000 scholarships

and \$1,000 scholarships will be available. Scholarship recipients will be recognized at the 2010 National Junior Angus Show (NJAS) in Denver, Colo.

The eligibility requirements for these general Angus Foundation scholarships remain the same. Angus youth who are graduating from high school or in college currently may also be eligible for other Angus-related scholarships that are permanently endowed and managed by the Angus Foundation.

The Foundation will also make available five graduate student scholarships to young men and women actively involved in the Angus breed who are pursuing an advanced degree.

The graduate student scholarship can only be applied to advanced degree studies. Applicants must have at one time been a National Junior Angus Association (NJAA) member and must currently be a junior, regular or life member of the American Angus Association. Strong preference and priority will be given to applicants pursuing advanced degrees related closely to the beef industry.
