

## Interconnectedness

As we head to Louisville, Ky., for the North American International Livestock Exposition (NAILE), the weather is starting to allow folks to make some progress in the fields. My husband Todd generally goes back to Minnesota to help his family with corn and soybean harvest. His trip was delayed this year due to rains. The drier weather in late Octoberearly November was welcome, but also frustrating as propane availability idled harvest and people in southern Minnesota started asking questions about a spring harvest.

## Don't feed a problem

As we go to press, some states were making exceptions to the hour restrictions for propane haulers, trying to speed delivery and keep driers drying.

It's disconcerting to look at the influence on corn futures of a day of sunshine, a news report of gas shortages or rainfall in another country on the other side of the globe. Of course, corn and soybean futures affect calf prices, calf prices affect feeder-calf prices, and feeder-calf prices affect bull prices.

Farmers are hoping for exceptional yields or high prices (or both, of course). Cattlemen would prefer they get exceptional yields, but no one wants a crop rotting or sprouting in the field.

As with any situation, there will be challenges and opportunities. It'll be a good year to consult with your local feed and Extension resources to see if there are some "situational" opportunities for buying feedstuffs this winter.

The need for nutrient analysis and toxin

screening of feedstuffs would seem a no-brainer this year. Make sure you know what you are dealing with to avoid feeding your cattle a problem.
