### **Apply for NJAA Ambassador Program**

The National Junior Angus Association (NJAA) Ambassador program is an educational and learning experience designed to recognize one outstanding junior Angus member who will support the production of the Angus breed and the consumption of Angus beef on a national and international level. The selected person will represent the NJAA at major beef industry conferences and events across the United States for one year.

American Angus Association members, ages 17-20 as of Jan. 1, 2013, of good standing and who own purebred cattle are eligible to

apply. A cover letter, résumé and essay questions are due June 15 to the Junior Activities Department, 3201 Frederick Ave., Saint Joseph, MO 64506.

The Ambassador program is one of the educational efforts made available through the Angus Foundation.

### **Nominate delegates now**

Only a few weeks remain to nominate delegates to represent each state or district at the 2013 American Angus Association

Convention of Delegates set for Monday, Nov. 18, in Louisville, Ky.

Each active Association member should have received a nomination form in the mail and may nominate one member from his or her state or district. All eligible nominations will be included on a ballot that will be mailed to members in July for the final selection of delegates.

Signed nominations must be received in the Association office no later than June 30 to be included on the final ballot. Remember, if your membership has expired or will expire in May or June, renew now. Only current members can be placed on the ballot.

If you know of a junior member who has purchased or raised a heifer that he or she wants to show, please make note of all ownership deadlines. If a deadline is fast approaching and you haven't received the transferred registration, the Association can help.

Contact the Association at least two weeks prior to the show ownership deadline. Every effort will be made to get the transfer processed in time. Remember, late transfers are never accepted, regardless of the reason.
