Fall NCE released this month

The release of the fall 2009 National Cattle Evaluation (NCE) is scheduled this month. Watch for new performance data to be posted online by July 13.

The fall 2009 NCE will include expected progeny differences (EPDs) for 14 traits measuring production, maternal and carcass performance as well as five dollar value indexes (\$Values).

Juniors should note new ownership terminology

Juniors participating in shows and concerned with ownership deadlines should take note. Beginning July 1, registration certificates will have a new look and some new wording. Ownership is currently based on the issue date listed on the bottom of the paper; beginning July 1, ownership will be based on process date.

Junior ownership deadline for the NAILE changes

The ownership deadline for the Angus junior show at the NAILE in Louisville, Ky., has changed and is now Sept. 1. The junior exhibitor must be the sole owner of the animal by Sept. 1, as listed on the certificate, and the process date on the certificate must reflect the Sept. 1 date.

Note junior deadlines for American Royal

The ownership (process) date and entry deadline for the American Royal junior Angus heifer show is Sept. 10. Please note that late entries are never accepted.
