Building an Angus legacy! deadline July 15

The Angus Foundation's granite paver drive has been extended to July 15, 2013. You have the opportunity to make a donation and be recognized on a granite paver of three different sizes and prices to suit your needs and budget. Only letters and numbers (no brands or logos) will be allowed for engraving on the granite pavers. However, in addition to the granite pavers, there will be the opportunity to be recognized on one of four granite planters that will be located prominently at the remodeled entrance. The four planters will be the only opportunities to have a brand or logo engraved into the granite. The second planter will be offered on www.angustradingpost.com July 1-11, and the winner will be announced at the NJAS in Kansas City.

A limited number of each size of granite paver will be available, so make sure to get your orders in as soon as possible. Orders will be accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis, and only after the donation is received will engraving begin on your paver. The Angus Foundation is accepting orders via mail and online through July 15. You will also be able to place orders at the NJAS. Elected delegates will conduct Association business at the 130th Annual Convention of Delegates Nov. 18 during the North American International Livestock Exposition (NAILE) in Louisville, Ky. If a delegate cannot attend, an alternate delegate can then attend and vote.

Association members who are seeking election to the Board of Directors of the American Angus Association may send a short biography, along with a photo, to *Angus Journal* Editor Shauna Hermel by Aug. 15. Biographies and photos submitted by the deadline will be published in the October *Angus Journal*, prior to the election at the Annual Convention in November. Biographies should be approximately 500-700 words and will be shortened if necessary.
