Certificate of Achievement deadline approaches

Juniors involved in Angus activities year-round are encouraged to apply for the Certificate of Achievement award given by the Auxiliary for outstanding achievements at national, state and district levels.

Achievements that qualify include champion or reserve champion Angus bull, heifer, steer or cow-calf pair; division champion or reserve division champion Angus bull, heifer, steer or cow-calf pair and class winners; awards in showmanship, judging, carcass classes, scholarship competitions, royalty competitions, and all National Junior Angus Association (NJAA) recognized competitions, including those at the National Junior Angus Show (NJAS).

Gold, Silver and Bronze awards also qualify, as do leadership roles or positions that were held during that time. These certificates are beneficial when applying for the Bronze, Silver and Gold awards through the National Junior Recognition Program, as well as applying for Auxiliary scholarships.

The Achievement Award application is available on the Auxiliary website, www.angusauxiliary.com, or by contacting committee co-chairs Kerri Gleason (kgleason@aircanopy.net, states beginning with A-L) or Erica Styles (cestyles@nvc.net, states beginning with M-W). Certificates are issued for outstanding achievement from Oct. 1 to Sept. 30. The deadline to submit completed applications is Nov. 1.
