The Auxiliary annually celebrates many traditions, including, but not limited to, Miss American Angus, the All-American Certified Angus Beef® Cook-Off, the Janet Castle Crystal Award, the Richard “Dick” Spader Award, the Pat Grote Award and the Black Kettle Award.

Scholarships

One of the most honored traditions of the Auxiliary are the American Angus Auxiliary Scholarship Awards. More than \$388,000 has been awarded in scholarships to 430 Angus youth since the inception of the program in 1956. Every year the applicants impress the judging panel with their accomplishments, scholastic achievements, and knowledge of the beef industry and Angus breed.

National Junior Angus Association (NJAA) members who are high school seniors and who have received their Bronze and Silver awards through the National Junior Recognition Program are eligible to apply by the May 1, 2017, deadline. Five male applicants and five female applicants are awarded scholarships totaling more than \$15,000 at the National Junior Angus Show (NJAS). The scholarship process also selects the candidates competing for the title of Miss American Angus at the annual Angus Convention.
