Slated for Sept. 26-28 in Boise, Idaho, "The Great Northwest Gathering" offers something for every Angus enthusiast.

The American Angus Association, along with its corporate partners Purina Mills, LLC, and Alpharma Animal Health, invite all producers to the conference and tour. The one-day conference begins with a Back to Basics program during which Association staff will provide program updates. The conference features top industry experts who will address all cycles of beef production, from reproduction to nutrition to end product.

The two-day tour, hosted by the Idaho and Oregon Angus associations, will feature ranches in a variety of terrain — from the desert to the mountains. Angus stops include 101 Ranch Inc., King Hill, Idaho; Spring Cove Ranch, Bliss, Idaho; Bear Mountain Angus Ranch, Melba, Idaho; Malson Angus Ranch, Parma, Idaho; and Thomas Angus Ranch, Baker City, Ore. Additional stops include the Academy of Equine Dentistry at Glenns Ferry, Idaho; the National Fish Hatchery, Hagerman, Idaho; and the Oregon Trail Interpretive Center, Baker City, Ore. All cattle stops will also host cattle from other producers.

"The breeders in the Northwest are excited to host this tour and showcase a part of the country that not many people pass through and see," Association Regional Manager Rod Wesselman says. "We hope everyone will take the time to come to Boise for the National Conference and Tour, and the opportunity to meet the people and see

Producers interested in attending the event have just a few weeks left to take advantage of the early registration fee. Register by Aug. 25 for \$75, which includes bus transportation, most meals and materials. After Aug. 25, the fee increases to \$100 per person.
