On Thursday, the tour will travel west and north to Bear Mountain Angus Ranch, Melba, Idaho; Malson Angus Ranch, Parma, Idaho; and Thomas Angus Ranch and the Oregon Trail Interpretive Center, both in Baker City, Ore. All cattle stops will also host cattle from other producers.

Registration is available for just \$75 and covers the conference, tour, meals and bus transportation during the tour. Register by Aug. 25 to get the early registration rate.
