American Angus Association to conduct business at 123rd Annual Convention of Delegates

American Angus Association members will converge at the 2006 North American International Livestock Exposition (NAILE) Nov. 11-14 in Louisville, Ky. A full slate of events is planned for attendees to the Association's 123rd Annual Convention of Delegates and the 2006 Super-Point Roll of Victory (ROV) Angus Show, designated the National Angus Show.

Registration for the event will begin Saturday, Nov. 11, at the Executive West Hotel, and will run from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. that day. Registration will also be available Sunday from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m., and Monday from 7 a.m. to 10 a.m. All delegates and Angus guests can pick up their name badges and show passes, as well as purchase banquet tickets, at the registration desk.

The Angus Foundation will host its Supporter Recognition Event on Saturday evening starting at 6 p.m. at the Executive West Hotel. The recognition event is by invitation to those who have contributed \$250 or more to the Angus Foundation during fiscal year (FY) 2006.

The American Angus Auxiliary will conduct its annual meeting starting at 3 p.m. on Saturday at the Executive West Hotel.

Sunday schedule

Numerous activities occur on Sunday, Nov. 12, including the junior Angus heifer show in Freedom Hall. Please check at the Angus registration desk or with show personnel for the order of breeds to be shown. The

Auxiliary will host its annual breakfast at the Executive West Hotel at 8 a.m., which is earlier than the previous year. Tickets for the breakfast are \$15, and can be purchased by contacting Sandra McCurry at (316) 667-2418 or (316) 304-5973 or by e-mail at sandramccurry3@aol.com.

Later that day, the Association Board of Directors will present a breeders' educational program that will begin at 1 p.m. in the Kentucky Fair and Exposition Center (KFEC) South Wing. Directors will give an overview of the organizational structure of the Association, its subsidiaries and affiliates.

Immediately following the educational program will be the open meeting for Association Board candidates and delegates. Each of the candidates will have the opportunity to introduce themselves to the members present, and delegates are encouraged to ask questions of candidates.

A total of 389 delegates from 46 states, the District of Columbia and Canada will conduct the business of the Association, including electing officers and five directors. The day will conclude with a social hour at 6 p.m., followed by the Angus Banquet at 7 p.m., at the Executive West Hotel.

Inductees into the Angus Heritage Foundation will be honored, and the National Junior Angus Association (NJAA) Outstanding Leadership Award winner will be recognized during the banquet.
