Association announces schedule for Angus events at the NAILE in Louisville, Ky.

embers of the American Angus Association and Angus enthusiasts from across the nation will gather at the 2005 North American International Livestock Exposition (NAILE) Nov. 12-15 in Louisville, Ky., at the Kentucky Fair and Exposition Center (KFEC). A full schedule of events is planned for attendees, including the American Angus Association's 122nd Annual Convention of Delegates and a Super-Point Roll of Victory (ROV) Angus Show. Registration will be open Saturday, Nov. 12, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the Executive West Hotel. Registration will also be available from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. Sunday and from 7 a.m. to 10 a.m. Monday. Delegates and Angus guests can pick up their name badges and show passes at the registration desk. Banquet tickets will also be available for purchase.

The Angus Foundation will host its Silver Anniversary Supporter Recognition Event and Fund-raiser on Saturday evening from 6 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. at the Executive West. The recognition

event, which is by invitation to those who have contributed \$250 or more to the Angus Foundation in fiscal year (FY) 2005, will celebrate the first 25 years of the Foundation. A one-of-akind rifle will be auctioned. See "Association Highlights" on page 40 for more details on the rifle.

The American Angus Auxiliary will also conduct two meetings on Saturday. The Auxiliary Executive Board will meet at 1 p.m., and the Auxiliary will conduct its annual meeting that evening immediately following the Foundation event. On Monday, Nov. 14, the Super-Point ROV Angus Show will begin at 8 a.m. in Freedom Hall. Jack Ward, Plattsburg, Mo., will evaluate the cattle. Bulls and cow-calf pairs will show on Monday. The 2005 Miss American Angus will be named prior to the selection of grand champion bull.

The Annual Convention of Delegates will begin at 2 p.m. Monday in the KFEC South Wing. Association President Minnie Lou Bradley, Memphis, Texas, will preside over the meeting. A total of 374 delegates from 45 states, the District of Columbia and Canada will conduct the business of the Association, including electing officers and five directors.

The day will conclude with a social hour at 6 p.m., followed by the Angus Awards Banquet at 7 p.m. at the Executive West.

Inductees into the Angus Heritage Foundation will be honored, and the National Junior Angus Association (NJAA) Outstanding Leadership Award winner will be recognized during the banquet.
