Angus Juniors claim top honors in national showmanship contest.

► Junior Angus exhibitors from 26 states competed for the title of top showman during the 40th annual National Junior Angus Showmanship Contest. The contest is sponsored in part by the American Angus Auxiliary and Andis[®] Clippers. unior Angus exhibitors from 26 states competed for the title of top showman during the 40th annual National Junior Angus Showmanship Contest July 14-15 during the National Junior Angus Show (NJAS) in Indianapolis, Ind. The 43 contestants first qualify at the state level and are allowed to compete at the national level only once. The contest is sponsored in part by the American Angus Auxiliary and Andis[®] Clippers.

Layne Armbruster, Burlington, Okla., claimed first-place honors after first being selected as one of 15 to compete in the final round. The prestigious title includes a monetary prize from the Hamilton James Memorial Fund and a silver Revere bowl — the Dean Hurlbut Award. The Jake White family also presented Armbruster with a handcrafted trophy belt buckle.

Darin Wiley, Saint Francis, Kan., captured second-place honors. Andrew Foster, Niles, Mich., won third place, and Justin Moritz, Piper City, Ill., claimed fourth. Gina Blanton, Marlow, Okla., rounded out the top five.

Each of the top five showmen received a silver Revere bowl from the Auxiliary and a monetary prize from the Hamilton James Memorial Fund, established in memory of Angus enthusiast and auctioneer Ham James.

Exhibitors do not show their own animals, but are randomly assigned heifers. They are evaluated on their skills in handling the animal, their ability to follow instructions, use of equipment, courtesy, sportsmanship and general appearance. After four preliminary rounds, 15 finalists are announced and awarded a set of clippers from Andis.


