FDA approves feeding combination

Producer grant guide released

The National Sustainable Agriculture Coalition (NSAC) has released a Farmer's Guide to Value-Added Producer Grant Funding. The guide was released on the heels of the USDA announcement of \$14 million in available funds for fiscal year 2012 for Value-Added Producer Grants (VAPG). Applications for the competitive grants program are due at USDA state rural development offices by Oct. 15, 2012.

VAPG awards funding to producers to help them develop farmrelated businesses that add value to basic agricultural products through processing, product differentiation, commodity segregation, on-farm energy production, labeling and certification, and local and regional food marketing.

The guide, available for free download online, includes clear information on new program rules and contains a step-by-step description of the application and ranking processes, with helpful hints to improve a producer's chances of obtaining funding from the highly competitive program. It also describes the program priorities for smalland medium-sized family farms, beginning farmers and ranchers, socially disadvantaged farmers and ranchers, and mid-tier value chains (regional supply networks with active farmer participation).

VAPG is a farm bill program and, as such, is up for renewal in the new Farm Bill Congress has been debating this year. To date, both the Senate-passed and House Committee-passed 2012 Farm Bills renew VAPG and both would provide it with \$50 million in total new mandatory funding for the next five years.
