Heated insoles

ThermaCell Technologies has introduced heated insoles that are the only cordless, remote controlled, rechargeable heated insoles with a built-in thermostat, according to ThermaCell.

The remote control allows instant temperature adjustment with the touch of a button while insoles remain in footwear. Integrated rechargeable lithium-ion polymer batteries allow for more than 500 charges lasting up to five hours per charge.

The insoles can be used in all types of footwear and will last for multiple winters of heavy use. They come in five sizes: S, M, L, XL and XXL. Heated insoles can be adjusted to accommodate any shoe size from a woman's 6 to a man's 13.

The remote control is designed to hang from a belt or keychain, and is small enough to fit in a pocket. The remote can activate the insoles from a distance as far away as 7 ft. It activates and allows the user to select from two temperature settings, in addition to no heat.

Hay market entrance

Kubota Tractor Corp. has announced it will enter the U.S. hay market in 2014 with an all-new line of hay tools.
