

► IN PASSING

Gary Vermeer, 90, Pella, Iowa, died Feb. 2 at the Comfort House of Pella.

Gary was born Sept. 29, 1918, in Pella, to Jacob and Anna Vermeer. He was raised in a farming community with strong Dutch roots. After his marriage in 1941 to Matilda Van Gorp, the couple started their lives together with 120 acres of land.

Gary and a cousin started the Vermeer

Manufacturing Co. in Pella in 1948 after inventing a wagon hoist five years earlier that made it easier to unload corn. From that small operation Vermeer Corp. grew into an international organization that manufactures agricultural, construction, environmental and industrial equipment.

Throughout the years, Gary continued to accumulate farmland, and though he hired farm managers as factory demands increased, he always took time out of his schedule to climb on the cultivator, planter or combine, as recently as spring of 2007.

Two of his children, Robert and Mary, now serve as co-chief executive officers (CEOs) of Vermeer Corp. Three of his grandchildren are also active in the corporation.

As well-known for his philanthropy as for his manufacturing success, the Vermeer Charitable Foundation, founded in 1958, made significant contributions to many local and world-wide projects, including many scholarship programs, building projects, disaster relief, aid for missions and more





