IN PASSING

Darwin Griffith, 88, Louisiana, Mo.,

formerly of Clarksville, Mo., died April 15.

Darwin was born at home March 22, 1923, to Warren and Ethyl (Humphrey) Griffith. He was their youngest child. He went to Calumet Grade School and graduated from Louisiana High School. He married Margaret Zumwalt July 4, 1943. They had three sons, Bart, Jerry and Randall.

Darwin farmed his entire life and was most intense about his registered Angus cow herd. He had been a life member of the American Angus Association since 1962. He was a lifetime member of the Calumet Presbyterian Church.

Darwin had been heard to say every man

should have one outstanding dog and one outstanding bull in his lifetime. He had two of each, including a coonhound named Star and a stock dog named Agent. His first noted bull, Tennessee, from the state of the same name, sired many county fair champions. Later, Hank, another prized bull, sired two international champions at Denver, Colo. Darwin managed to work the entire family into the cattle operation.

In addition to farming, he drove a school bus for a time, was a guard at Dundee Cement, and served as a Pike County Judge for two terms. He did field compliance measurement for the U.S. Department of

Darwin is survived by sons Bart and Randall, eight grandchildren and nine greatgrandchildren.

Mary Darlene McCurry, 70, Mount Hope, Kan., died May 7 at Via Christi Regional Medical Center, Saint Francis Campus, Wichita, Kan., following an 11-year battle with cancer.

Darlene was born Dec. 27, 1940, in Hutchinson, Kan., the daughter of Clifford and Helen (Barnett) Stewart. She was a 1958 graduate of Haven High School and was a resident of the rural Mount Hope area for 50 years.

In 1962, Darlene married Robert McCurry of Sedgwick, Kan., a founding partner of McCurry Bros. Angus. She worked as a registered nurse for approximately 40 years. Darlene was a lifelong member of Haven Baptist Church, Haven, Kan.

In addition to her husband, Darlene is survived by daughter Konnie; brothers Buck, Larry and Ted; sister Barbara; six grandchildren; and six great-grandchildren.

Marvin Walter, 70, Ames, Iowa, died June 1 after an eight-year struggle with multiple myeloma.

Marvin was born Aug. 22, 1940, to Regina and Ralph Walter. He was raised on a farm near Watkins, Iowa, and graduated from high school in Blairstown in 1958. He received two degrees in animal science at Iowa State University in 1962 and 1964.

Marvin married Janice Gordon Sept. 19, 1964. They spent five years in Chicago, where Marvin first worked for the American Meat Institute, then as a commodity broker on the floor of the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. In 1968 they came back to start a meat-related business with two partners. Through the years he operated Carriage House Meat & Provision Co. and several affiliated businesses. On the state and national level, he was involved in several organizations related to the livestock and meat industry.

Marvin was president of the National CUP Lab[™] and Technology Center and was instrumental in moving centralized ultrasound processing to the private sector more than 10 years ago. He was featured in the January 2008 *Angus Journal* (see page 145-147).

In addition to his wife, Marvin is survived by daughters Allyson and Stacy; brother Russell; sisters Patricia and Kathy; three grandsons; and two step-grandchildren.
