Additionally, the nine student advisory team members are responsible for planning and facilitating the 2015 AFA Leaders Conference Nov. 5-8 in Kansas City, Mo. Their planning kicked off March 29-31, when all 28 students convened in Kansas City for training and to develop the 2015 conference theme.

Throughout the summer, the Student Advisory Team will visit partners and potential partners of AFA in California, Nebraska, Iowa and Minnesota. They will have opportunities to discuss various facets of agriculture and business with leaders from the organizations. Bruce Akey has been named the director of the Texas A&M Veterinary Medical Diagnostic Laboratory by the Texas A&M System Board of Regents. Akey began as executive deputy director at the lab in June 2014 and had served as interim director since September 2014.

Rick Bennett has been named the new director of the Kentucky Agricultural Experiment Station and associate dean for research at the University of Kentucky (UK) College of Agriculture, Food and Environment. As experiment station director, his primary task will be to promote the success of the research enterprise in the college. He will also supervise several support programs critical to Kentucky's economy, including the Division of Regulatory Services, the UK Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory, the Kentucky Tobacco Research and Development Center, the Research and Education Center in Princeton and the Robinson Center for Appalachian Resource Sustainability in Quicksand.

Bennett will assume his new duties June 1.

Kenneth Spearman has been designated by President Barack Obama as chairman and CEO of the Farm Credit Administration (FCA), effective March 13. He succeeds Jill Long Thompson, who served as chair and CEO since Nov. 27, 2012. As chairman, Spearman will be responsible for policymaking, adopting regulations and overseeing the examination and regulation of the institutions constituting the Farm Credit System (FCS), including the Federal Agricultural Mortgage Corp.

Dallas Tonsager has been sworn in as a member of the FCA Board. Tonsager was nominated to the post Jan. 26, 2015, and confirmed by the U.S. Senate March 9. He will serve the remainder of the six-year term previously held by Jill Long Thompson, which expires May 21, 2020.

Jeffery Hall has been sworn in as a member of the FCA Board. He will serve the remainder of the six-year term previously held by Leland Strom, which expires Oct. 13, 2018.

Robert Carlson and **Clay Pederson** (posthumously) were honored by the National Farmers Union (NFU) with the award for Meritorius Service during the organization's convention in March. Meritorius Service Awards honor those who have made particularly noteworthy contributions to agriculture, humanity and Farmers Union. The honor is the highest award the NFU Board can bestow on an individual.
