IBEP 2009 Summer Test Bedford. Ind. Initial report

Bulls were delivered Tuesday, April 28. There are 74 bulls from 26 cooperators in the test. Of the 74 bulls, 55 of the entries were Angus.

The test's purpose is to promote performance testing and carcass evaluation of beef cattle and to serve as an educational tool to acquaint producers with their value; to complement on-farm performance testing; to provide a common environment for evaluating the performance of young bulls; to assist breeders in identifying sires whose progeny excel in growth rate, feed conversion and carcass value; and to aid beef producers in obtaining superior, performance-tested bulls that have been evaluated for growth, breeding and structural soundness, along with carcass merit.

2009 Clemson Bull Testing **Program Nominations**

The 2009 Clemson Bull Test nominations are due Aug. 1, and the 2009 Edisto Forage Bull Test nominations are due Oct. 15.

Consignors should complete and submit their nominations, with the \$100-per-bull nomination fee, as soon as possible. If you know which bulls you will be nominating, do not wait on their weaning weights before sending in the nominations. Weaning weights can be added later. For an embryo transplant (ET) bull, the recipient's birth date should be provided. It is very important to provide the actual birth weight, weaning date and weaning weight for each bull. When deciding which bulls to nominate, breeders should pay particular attention to expected progeny differences (EPDs), muscling, structural soundness, disposition, scrotal circumference and weaning performance.

Nomination deadlines are set early enough to give consignors time to receive official notification of acceptance or rejection of their bulls before going to the expense of

brucellosis testing, persistent bovine viral diarrhea (PI BVD) testing and gathering of health papers.
