The 39th Calhoun Bull Evaluation Program began June 30-July 1 with the delivery of 132 bulls.

"As with most parts of the state, it has been hot, dry and dusty," reports Ronnie Silcox, Extension animal scientist. "Health in general has been good, but we have had a few bulls that have been treated for respiratory illness."

The test's purpose is to record differences in ability of bulls to gain in a uniform environment, while providing breeders with a sound scientific basis for selecting bulls with ability to gain weight rapidly and to make such bulls available to cattlemen.

"We changed to a soy hull, corn gluten and corn ration this year, giving up a little bit of gain to have a ration that you can afford," Silcox says.


