

Pennsylvania Bull Performance Test Livestock Evaluation Center, Pennsylvania Furnace, Pa. 28-day report (Nov. 29, 2005)

Beef producers from Pennsylvania, Maryland, New York, West Virginia and New Jersey started 140 bulls on the 112-day performance evaluation Nov. 9, 2005. Of the breeds on test at the facility, Angus has the greatest overall number, with 93 bulls. Northeast Colorado test begins

The Northeast Colorado Bull Test Association (NCBTA) kicked off its 30th annual performance test, receiving 90 bulls from 22 seedstock producers.

"NCBTA provides an opportunity for producers from across the region to performance-test their genetics in an unbiased, controlled environment. Our goal is to improve beef performance through data discovery, competition and education," said David Colburn, Logan County Extension livestock agent and NCBTA test coordinator. "There are few other facilities where cattlemen can see and evaluate bulls from multiple breeds and multiple producers being tested on an equal footing." For the past 29 years, the NCBTA has offered its top-performing test bulls for sale. In 2005, cattlemen had opportunity to sort through more than 50 bulls, including three that gained more than 5 lb. per day during the 120-day test on a 60% forage ration.

The 2005-2006 test includes Angus, Red Angus, Hereford, commercial Angus, Maine Anjou, Simmental, Gelbvieh and Balancer. There are calving-ease divisions for Angus and Red Angus, as well as a commercial Angus division. The bulls posted an average on-test weight of 751 lb.

The bulls will complete the 120-day test March 1, 2006. Bulls will be indexed based on ADG and WDA. Only bulls indexing at 95% or better will qualify for the sale. In addition to ADG and WDA, NCBTA provides individual ultrasound data on all bulls to assist cattlemen in their selections.

The annual NCBTA sale will be Saturday, April 1, 2006, at the test site. Visitors are always welcome at the test site, which is located between Atwood and Akron, Colo., on Colorado Highway 63.

Bulls were recently weighed on test for Minnesota Beef Cattle Improvement Association (MBCIA) tests. Three tests are under way.

Thirty-five bulls representing eight breeders are consigned to the Foundation Feeders Private Test. Denoted by white tags, the January-April 2005 bulls had an average starting weight of 736 lb. and gained an average of 2.73 lb. per day during the warmup period.

Seventeen bulls, including four Angus, are consigned to the Spring Grove Sale Bull Test. They carry yellow test tags. Born in February-March 2005, the Angus bulls had an average starting weight of 744 lb., with a 1.80-lb. ADG during the warm-up period. All 17 bulls averaged 744 lb. going on test after gaining an average of 1.49 lb. per day during the warm-up period.
