The Canadian Angus Association is pleased to announce the winners of the 2013 National Gold Show Program. The 2013 Black Angus Show Bull of the Year is HF Thunderbird 146Y, owned by Tanya Belsham, Houston, B.C.; and Hamilton Farms, Cochrane, Alta.

The reserve champion Black Angus Show Bull of the Year was awarded to Remitall F Prospector 110Z, owned by Willow Springs Angus Ltd., Westbridge, B.C.; and Remitall Farms Inc., Olds, Alta. Runner-up champion was Kemp Brothers All the Way 8A, owned by Kemp Bros., Blackstock, Ont.

The Black Angus Show Female of the Year is DMM Blackcap Essence 7Y with daughter DMM TR Lady Essence 13A, owned by Lee and Dawn Wilson, Bashaw, Alta.

The reserve champion for Black Angus Show Female of the Year went to Soo Line Annie K 1094 with daughter EF VOS Annie K 16A, owned by Sean Enright and Barry Enright, Renfrew, Ont. Runner-up champion was Remitall F Karma 102W with son Remitall

F Rage 9A, owned by Remitall Farms Inc.

Canadian Angus Gold Show All-Star Team awards were also announced as follows.

In the Black Angus bulls, calf champion was Kemp Brothers All the Way 8A, by Kemp Bros.; junior champion went to Remitall F Prospector 110Z, by Willow Springs Angus Ltd., and Remitall Farms Inc.; and senior champion was HF Thunderbird 146Y, by Tanya Belsham and Hamilton Farms.

Black Angus female All-Star awards went to Tom DeWaal, Prince George, B.C., with Harvest Blackbird Lisa 5A as the calf champion; William Pilgrim, Renfrew, Ont., and Sean Enright and Barry Enright with Champion Hill Georgina 8229 as the junior champion; and Lee and Dawn Wilson with DMM Blackcap Essence 7Y and daughter DMM TR Lady Essence 13A as the senior champion.

The winners were recognized at the Canadian Western Agribition in Regina, Sask., Friday, Nov. 15.

The Gold Show program was developed in 1989 by the Canadian Angus Association

to provide an incentive for breeders to move between regions to show cattle. Gold Show winners are determined by the animal(s) that earned the highest number of points in three Gold Shows. If an animal accumulated points in more than three Gold Shows, the points from their best three shows were used in determining end-of-year awards.

The Canadian Angus Association is Canada's largest purebred beef breed organization. The Association represents 3,000 members across Canada for the purposes of registering and recording the pedigrees of purebred Angus cattle in the closed Herd Book and promoting the breed across Canada. The member-approved mandate is to maintain breed registry, breed purity and provide services that enhance the growth and position of the Angus breed.
